

A fresh take on the time loop trope, a rom com that takes place over a single iteration of the loop – just one sunny day in May. A character-centred story following two sixteen-year-olds walking around contemporary Dublin, it's Before Sunrise meets Groundhog Day for readers of books like David Levithan's Every Day. And One Day.

Harmony's a school drop-out stuck in a dead-end job. Liam is the self-declared 'King of Dublin' cheerfully stuck in a twenty-four-hour time loop. Fearful that she (and the rest of the universe) is unwittingly trapped in the loop too, Harmony convinces Liam to give her until the midnight reset to break the cycle. As her attempts fall flat and their personalities clash and time runs out, they find there's more than one way to get unstuck.



But the streets of Victorian London are not an easy place to be a woman – least of all one as striking as Frances. Wooed by the showman of a questionable 'theatre troupe,' taken in by shrewd spiritualists and charmed by a collection of hedonistic Pre-Raphaelites, Frances must reckon with what it means to inhabit a body that does not conform; grappling with how the world sees her versus who she is discovering herself to be.

For the passengers time stands still and memory is so fragmentary and unreliable that it's difficult to know whether you are one of the many ghost passengers tied to the ship.

The four meet as strangers, but each of them knows that their pasts are somehow intertwined.

A chilling rule governs their passage: no new tickets, only exchanges. Marin and Ronan must journey through love and loss to try and rewrite fate. But as Hollis and Jay swap their tickets, secrets unravel, and tragic connections are revealed. Caught between the liminal world of the ferry and life on the Island, memory becomes a map but the route to redemption may cost them everything.

Emily has won the Bristol Short Story Prize and her short stories have been included in numerous anthologies. Her debut novel, *The Longest Fight*, published by Myriad, was shortlisted for the Cross Sports Book Awards, and listed in *The Independent's* Paperbacks of the Year. Her second novel, *Inside the Beautiful Inside*, was published in 2020 by Everything with Words and reviewed in both *The Times* and *The Observer*; a collection of short stories, *Human Terrain*, was published in 2021 and longlisted for the Edge Hill Prize 2022.
